*George Hutzlar* according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for *the West half of the North West quarter of Section Thirty four, in Township Thirty one, North of Range Fifteen, West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Traverse City, Michigan, containing Eighty acres.*

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said *George Hutzlar*

United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said

and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said

*George Hutzlar*

and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.
