Whereas there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a CERTIFICATE of the Register of the Land Office at Grayling Michigan, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act

of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Joseph Haas

has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the Lot numbered one excluding ten acres and fifteen hundredths of an acre reserved for Light House purposes, and the Lots numbered two and three of Section ten in Township thirty North of Range fifteen West of Michigan Meridian in Michigan, containing after making the exception above specified one hundred and thirty-seven acres and fifty hundredths of an acre.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Joseph Haas

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Joseph Haas and to his

heirs and assigns forever. This Patent is issued in lieu of one dated April 1, 1892, which has been canceled, and which erroneously included the tract reserved for Light House purposes.

In testimony whereof I, William McKinley President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the twenty-seventh day of December, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and twenty-third.
